## **Lublin Trade Mission to Canada 2005**

The Lublin Trade Mission consisting of officials, scientists and business people visited it's twin city of Windsor, Ontario as well as the city of Toronto, Ontario, Canada from October 12<sup>th</sup> to the 20<sup>th</sup>, 2005. The three goals of this Mission were:

- 1. To strengthen contacts between the twin cities of Lublin and Windsor.
- To participate in the Hostex and Canadian Manufacturing and Technology shows in Toronto, Ontario.
- The creation of new business and educational opportunities between Poland and Canada.
  The City of Lublin (Promotion Office) and the Enterprise Development Association of Lublin were responsible for the organization of the Lublin Trade Mission 2005.

## Windsor

The visit to Windsor was organized by the City of Windsor (International Relations Committee) with the significant help of the Polish Canadian Business and Professional Association of Windsor.

On the first day of our visit to Windsor our delegation met with numerous city officials such as Eddie Francis, Mayor, Jo-Anne Gignac, David Cassivi and David Brister, Councilors. During the City of Windsor luncheon held at The Hiram Walker Club, various city officials, business people and scientists were invited to discuss new opportunities for a scientist and student exchange as well as a municipal practices exchange. Windsor is the automotive capital of Canada and it was extremely important for the Mission to visit one of the leading manufacturer of robots for the automotive industry in North America, Valiant Tools Co.

Later the delegation had the opportunity to learn more about the Polish Community of Windsor. They visited 'Polonia Park', a residential project containing 342 condominiums and apartments established 25 years ago and run by the Polish Community.

On the second day of the visit, the Mission enjoyed a tour of the University of Windsor organized by Dr. Frank Simpson. During a luncheon the University's officials, researchers and representatives presented their involvement and interests. For example, Michelle Watters presented a GIS system and discussed the possibilities of the use of this system in Lublin. Meeting with Dr. Diana Kao, Associate Dean of the Odette School of Business was interesting because in the past Dr. Marta Revenly also from this school was a lecturer at the Lublin School of Business, Lublin, Poland. As well,

representatives from two local hospitals were on hand to discuss with Dr. Adam Borowicz the Director of the Clinical Hospital of the Medical Academy of Lublin the possibility of a doctor and student exchange program.

The most significant event of the visit to Windsor was the 11<sup>th</sup> Annual Polish-Canadian Business and Professional Society Dinner organized by the Polish-Canadian Business and Professional Association of Windsor. This was a great opportunity to celebrate the 5<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the signing of the partnership agreement between Lublin and Windsor. Our delegation was honored by the presence of many significant speakers including the Polish Ambassador to Canada, the H.E. Dr. Piotr Ogrodzinski, the Polish Consul General, Dr. Piotr Konowrocki, the Ukrainian Consul General, Dr. Ihor Lossovskyi, MP for Windsor-Tecumseh, Joe Comartin, Mayor of the City of Windsor, Eddie Francis, MPP for Windsor-West, and Minister of Community & Social Services, the Hon. Sandra Pupatello, the Deputy Mayor of Lublin, Ryszard Pasikowski, as well as the president of Schwartz Canada, New York, Sam Schwartz. This event was yet another wonderful opportunity for the delegates to meet many key people and create additional valuable links with business and professional people from the Windsor area.

## **Toronto**

From Windsor the Mission travelled to Toronto to participate in the Hostex and Canadian Manufacturing and Technology shows. Delegates took part in the shows according to their individual needs and interests.

The most important event in Toronto was a luncheon meeting with the Polish Consulate General. This luncheon was organized by Dr. Piotr Konowrocki and provided a wonderful opportunity to meet many Canadian business people of Polish descent as well as encouraging the exchange of information, the building of new business relationships and discussions regarding the possibility of Canadian investments in Lublin.

From Toronto the Mission continued on to Erie, Pennsylvania, USA, another very active twin city of Lublin. In my opinion, the goals of the Lublin Trade Mission to Canada 2005 were achieved.
