

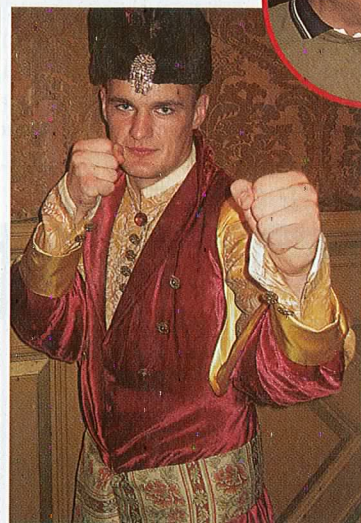
MITCHEL RAPHAEL ON A HUGGY HARPER AND WHY THE JAFFERS ARE BRINGING GOATS

DID HARPER INHALE?

At the apology for native residential schools, the most moving response from the House floor came from **Mary Simon**, president of the Inuit Tapiriit Kanatami, who was wearing a seal fur vest. Her emotional thank you caused misty eyes. She even received an extremely rare public hug from the PM after she spoke. She confirmed later to Capital Diary the hug was "firm." After the apology in the Commons there was another gathering at which **Stephen Harper** took part in a smudging ceremony and was offered a ceremonial pipe, something he had not been warned was going to happen. The PM put the pipe to his lips, but it didn't look like he inhaled. One of the attendees at the apology was **Fred Sasakamoose**. The day before, he told Capital Diary, "I want my childhood back. And I think tomorrow I am going to receive it." At the school, they taught him hockey. "I came out of it pretty good. The priests were tough. They were good coaches, they meant business." The 75-year-old retired Sasakamoose became the first Canadian Aboriginal player for the NHL, playing for the Chicago Blackhawks in 1954.

100 YEARS OF HARPER

When Stephen Harper spoke at a Hill reception honouring Polish-Canadian milestones, including the 75th anniversary of the Canadian Polish Congress, he had the room laughing when he asked whether someone could help him with his Polish pronunciation of Kaszuby, the first Polish settlement in Canada, now celebrating its 150th anniversary. "I'm still working on French," he

joked. The PM acknowledged well-known Canadians of Polish ancestry, including the next chief of defence staff, Lt.-Gen. **Walter Natynczyk**, who was in attendance. The PM's speech was followed by traditional Polish chants proclaiming he should live for 100 years. Harper was later greeted by two-time Ontario boxing champion and poli-sci student **Lukas Welniak**, wearing traditional garb from Poland's

Mazur region. When Welniak requested a photo with the PM, Harper said, "Since you're dressed like this I'll have a pic." After the snap the PM quipped, "You don't dress like this every day?"

RAHIM JAFFER'S VERSION OF 'MEET THE PARENTS'
