



The University of Windsor's Leddy Library, in collaboration with the Polish-Canadian Business and Professional Association of Windsor, hosted the inaugural launch of the Polish-Canadian Commemorative Exhibition: A Canada 150 Tribute and Celebration in recognition of Canada's 150th birthday and the contribution of Poles to the development of this great country, at the Leddy Library of the University of Windsor on April 7, 2017.
